Here East has today announced that renowned international choreographer Wayne McGregor will be opening 'Studio Wayne McGregor' at Here East, the unique campus for the creative and digital industries being developed at the former Press and Broadcast Centres on Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park.

Utilising Here East's renowned infrastructure, Studio Wayne McGregor will be a home for McGregor, his company and collaborators, and a major new resource for the local community. The pioneering project will provide access to state-of-the-art studios for artists in return for their time and skills working within the local community.

The announcement is further evidence of the cultural and economic legacy being delivered as a result of the London 2012 Olympic Games. Alongside the development of Studio Wayne McGregor at Here East, the Mayor of London's 'Olympicopolis' plans include a second exhibition space for the Victoria & Albert Museum and the first UK public space for America's Smithsonian Institution.

Wayne McGregor, international choreographer and founder of Studio Wayne McGregor said, "It is clear that dance, choreographic processes and creativity have a part to play in the fast-changing technological and digitally motivated landscape we find ourselves in, where thinking through and with our bodies - in a broad range of contexts from robotics to cognitive science, artificial intelligence to health, education to experience - challenges and re-calibrates what the artform can really achieve and invent into the future. This vision excites and motivates us. We are ambitious for dance and adventurous for its wider application. The space we have chosen for our new home, within Here East with its unique and diverse maker ecology, makes manifest this aspiration. Studio Wayne McGregor will be a shared space for making, where artists can exchange knowledge and invent together. It will be a crucible of collaboration across disciplines and scale. It will be a base from which we can work with local communities and young people to share experiences and nurture creativity."

Here East is currently over 40% pre-let including key tenants BT Sport (who already broadcast live premiership football directly from Here East), Loughborough University, Hackney Community College and Infinity SDC. A new centre will also be opened at Loughborough University in London, located at Here East, to act as the London Hub of the Advanced Propulsion Centre (APC) as part of the Government's commitment to developing low-carbon vehicle technology.

Construction works to transform the buildings at Here East began on 20th October 2014 and are being carried out by Laing O'Rourke. The former Press Centre will be ready for occupation in early summer 2015, while Loughborough University will open its brand new London campus to its first cohort of students in October 2015. The former Broadcast Centre will feature office and studio space, and will undergo a phased delivery, with the complete space ready for occupation in early 2016.
