Here East, London's home for making based on Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park, will unveil a new public artwork by leading British artist Gavin Turk. Disembodied from any room, structure or building, this oversized painted door appears, given its peeling varnish, to have been left to the elements for some years. The door opens onto infinite possibilities and nothingness alike.

The arrival of this unique, large-scale structure signals Here East's role as a major new hub for London's creative and digital industries. By installing this significant artwork by an internationally renowned local artist, Here East states not only that it is open for business to the international creative and digital community, but also that it warmly welcomes and supports the artistic community of Hackney Wick. Here East will offer 22 affordable studios for artists from next year, showing its commitment to supporting the thriving local creative community. Situated as visitors enter the site from Hackney Wick, the door symbolises Here East's vision as a home for local artists.

A playful homage to William Blake's famous doors of perception, and to René Magritte's painting 'La Victoire', visitors are invited to walk through Turk's trompe l'oeil door into the enchanting realms of the imagination and beyond. As ever, the work highlights philosophical contradictions and is a key work within Turk's oeuvre.
