Get Living, one of the UK's leading build-to-rent companies with a portfolio of almost 5,000 homes, is bringing forward new proposals for the West Site of the Elephant and Castle Town Centre development.

The plans are set to improve and diversify the masterplan for a better resident and visitor experience while reducing environmental impact, and form part of Get Living's redevelopment of Elephant and Castle that will provide a diverse new town centre. Get Living is currently progressing with the construction of the East site, set to complete in 2026, that will provide 135,000 sq ft of retail and leisure space, 55,000 sq ft of workspace, 485 homes and new transport infrastructure alongside a new university building for UAL's London College of Communication.

The project was granted consent in 2019 to build on the current site of the London College of Communication (LCC), University Arts London, which sits alongside Get Living's existing neighbourhood at Elephant Central.

Since 2019, policy and regulatory changes have been introduced to reflect greater building safety and sustainability requirements for new developments and Get Living is using the opportunity to improve its proposals to ensure they better meet the needs of the local area.
